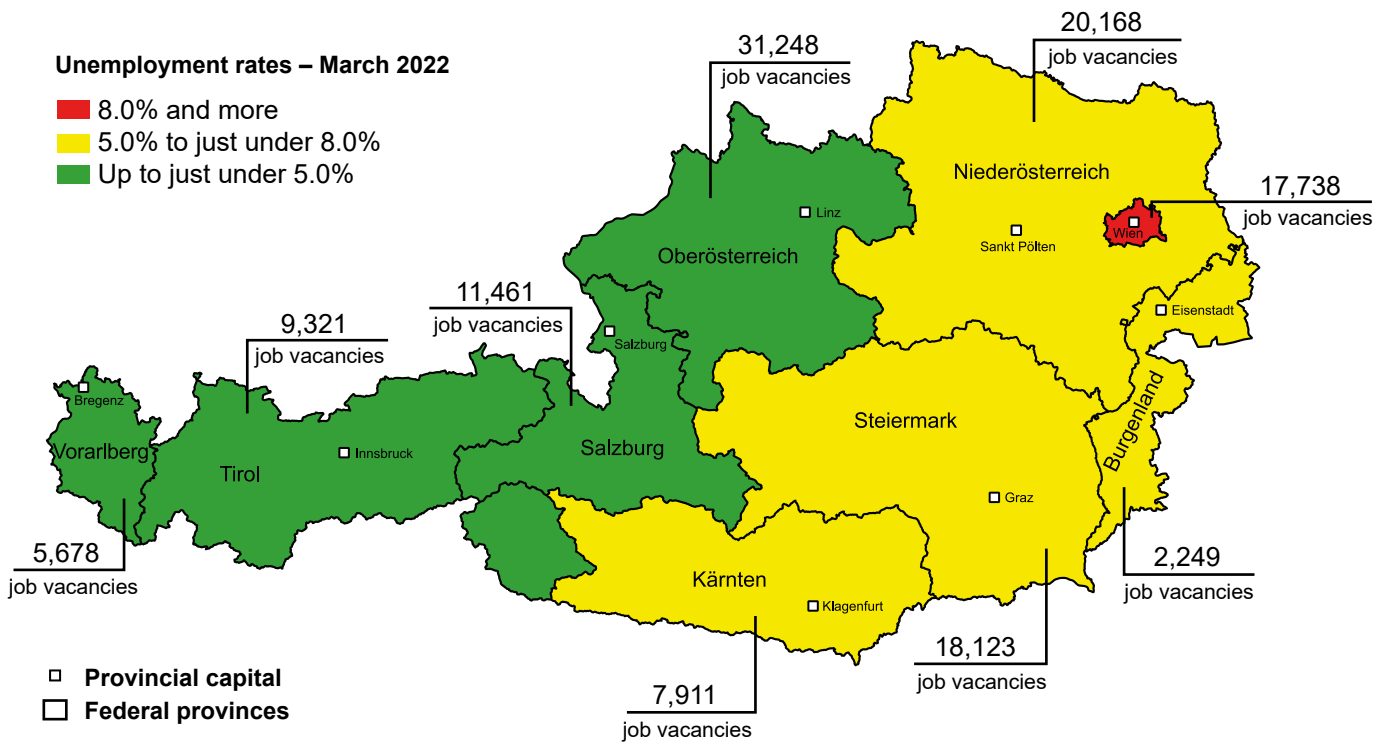


## JOB OPPORTUNITIES IN AUSTRIA

Austria has nine federal provinces (Bundesländer): These are Burgenland, Carinthia (Kärnten), Lower Austria (Niederösterreich), Upper Austria (Oberösterreich), Salzburg, Styria (Steiermark), Tyrol (Tirol), Vorarlberg and Vienna (Wien). The federal province Vienna is, at the same time, the federal capital and also Austria's most populous city.

The unemployment rate differs significantly depending on the federal province. The highest unemployment rate is in Vienna, followed by the federal provinces Burgenland and Carinthia (Kärnten).

### Regional shortage occupations

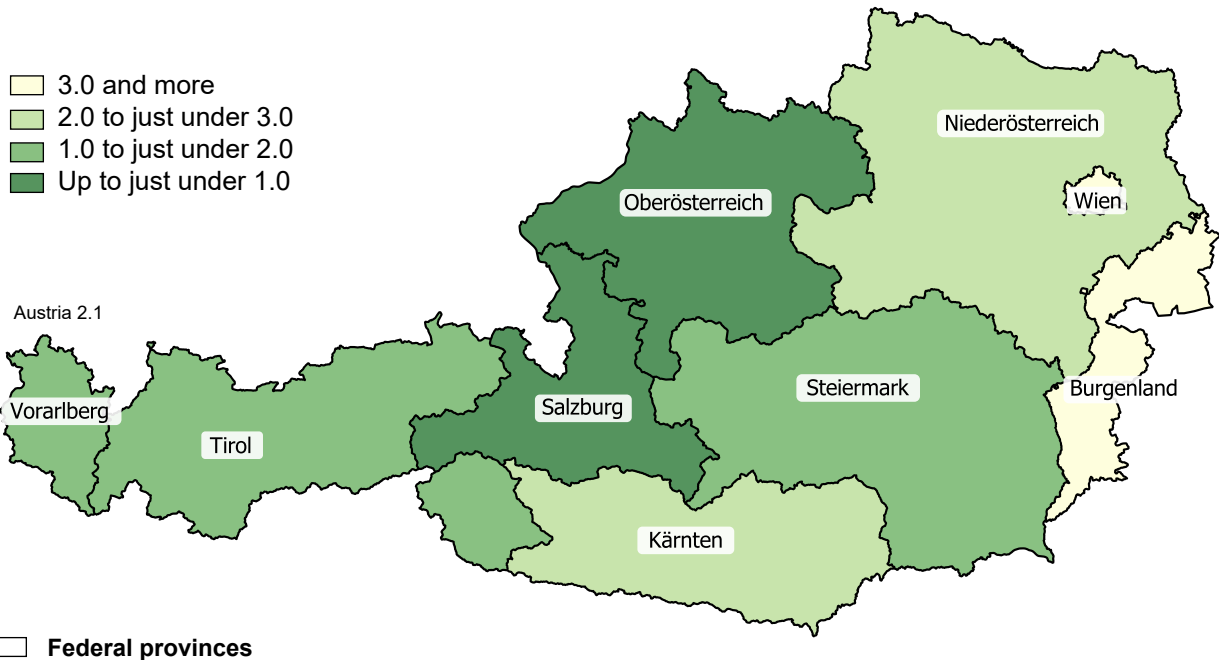
In the federal provinces skilled workers are most wanted in the following occupations:

## Ratio of unemployed persons to job vacancies in March 2022



Note: In Vienna, for example, there are more than three unemployed persons per job vacancy; in Salzburg, however, less than one unemployed person.

### IMPORTANT!

- > To be able to work in Austria, refugees from Ukraine require an **employment permit** issued by the Public Employment Service (AMS). The company must apply for the employment permit at the AMS.
- > In Austria – depending on occupation or current job – wages must not fall below the minimum wages defined in collective agreements.
