

INFORMATION FOR REFUGEES FROM UKRAINE

The Public Employment Service Austria (AMS) is happy to support you in finding a job. In this letter you will find important information on job placement, counselling and German classes.

What do I need in order to be permitted to stay in Austria?

To be permitted to stay in Austria for more than three months, you need an ID Card for Displaced Persons (Blue Residence Card).



This identity card is issued by the police. To obtain such an ID, you have to register. In Vienna, the registration site is here: <https://start.wien.gv.at/ukraine>

The ID card will then be sent to you by post.

Do I get financial support until I find work?

The City of Vienna will provide you with a so-called basic allowance. For this allowance, you have to sign up at our registration and counselling center in the Austria Center Vienna.

Can I work in Austria?

Yes! You will need an ID Card for Displaced Persons to be allowed to work here. The company you want to work for must first apply for an employment permit at the AMS. You may only start working after this employment permit has been issued. Find all the information you need on our website <https://www.ams.at>

How do I find a job?

The AMS will support you in finding a job. Please be sure to come to the AMS office responsible for your district of residence and register as a job seeker.

Don't forget to bring with you:

- Your Blue Residence Card (ID Card for Displaced Persons)
- Your E-Card (social security card) or a confirmation of your social security number, if already available



If you speak little or no German yet, we ask you to take an adult companion with you who is able to communicate fluently with us.

What kind of support do I get from the AMS?

We support you with information and advice on:

- Job placement
- German classes
- Official recognition of your education and professional training
- Courses for further education and training
- Childcare advice
- Special offers for women

The AMS also offers counselling appointments in Ukrainian, if required.

Where can I find more support for my integration in Austria?

The Austrian Integration Fund (ÖIF) offers **counselling and German classes**.
